years she has been my best friend. It has often been difficult to maintain enthusiasm without her

around. However, thanks to oodles of love, prayer, support, and quite a bit of regular exercise, I am becoming more and more positive.

The children have been amazing. William bonded with me very early, and has spent most of the last 6 months either with his hand on my chest, or his head up my jumper. He is usually very smiley, and has gained in confidence. He is such a delight.

Anna has absolutely loved South Cerney and School. Stephanie worked very hard on her home schooling, and now she seems to love learning. She has discovered reading, and is now on her third Harry Potter. She has started violin lessons, and is the only girl to go



regularly to super soccer football training. She is so bright and feisty; she reminds me of Stephanie so much.



Edward has recovered amazingly from his injuries. He still has some facial wounds that can be painful if caught. He is the family peace maker. He is very philosophical about most things, and providing he is not hungry, tired, thirsty, or thwarted, is adorable.
